

This Risk Assessment covers the following activities:

Big Group Game/s: An energetic and competitive wide game or a combination of short, interactive, and unique favourite camp games.
Ratio: 1 Instructor and 2 Attending Group Staff per 40 Participants
Age suitability: All ages
Location: Valley and Oval
Benefit of activity: Team development, communication, personal and social learning, fun

Initiatives: Various team building challenges using a range of low adventure elements and equipment. Groups are presented with an aim and guidelines, and the Instructor observes and facilitates the process as required.
Ratio: 1 Instructor and 1 Attending Group Staff per 18 Participants
Age suitability: Year 4+
Location: Valley and Oval
Benefit of activity: Team development, communication, personal and social learning, adventure

Molecule Madness
(Primary Age): Teams work together to compete in mini challenges, earning special materials in order to recreate a hidden molecule structure.
Ratio: 1 Instructor and 2 Attending Group Staff per 40 Participants
Age suitability: Year 4-6
Location: Oval
Benefit of activity: Team development, communication, personal and social learning, fun

Molecule Madness:
(High School Age): Teams work together to recreate a hidden molecule structure. Teams are split into two halves- one half can see the original creation and the other half must recreate the structure- neither team can see what the other team is looking at or building. Teams are also faced with constantly changing barriers to communication.
Ratio: 1 Instructor and 2 Attending Group Staff per 40 Participants
Age suitability: Year 7+
Location: Valley, Oval, and Gazebo
Benefit of activity: Team development, communication, personal and social learning

Towers of Hanoi – To prevent crushed hands and feet- Participants are instructed to only move one tyre at a time, must have at least two people moving each tyre, and carefully lower tyres on top of others or to the ground. Balance Board – To prevent falls, jarring, and crushed feet- Participants are instructed to only enter/exit the Balance Board from the middle on each side, always move slowly, not jump up and down, and remain standing at all times. While waiting off the Balance Board, participants must stand at least one metre back. A Frames – To prevent being hit by the frames, falling, and entanglement with ropes - frames must be spaced at least 10 meters apart and the Participants around each frame must stay at least 3 meters back- measured near the end of each rope with a knot, without excess rope to trip or become entangled in. Participants must hold ropes taut to support the frame, making sure the frame always has at least one point of contact at all times. The climbers on each frame will also be fitted with a helmet. <u>Molecule Madness:</u> To prevent being poked/punctured by the wooden skewers- Participants are instructed to take care using the equipment everything must be kept on the specified tables for building their structure at all times.
